#### **Rector's Letter**

Dear Friends:

As we enter the season of Lent I invite you to join with me in a spiritual practice I have found helpful over the years. In the early church, Lent was a time when those preparing for baptism entered into a period of 40 days of prayer and fasting. The rest of the community of faith also entered into this special 40-day period as a time to renew their own baptism. On Easter Day, all would join together to welcome the newly baptized.

Over the years, I have developed a Lenten practice of spending time in prayer and reflection on the baptismal covenant found in the Book of Common Prayer. Each week in Lent, I focus on one of the questions we ask the newly baptized during the liturgy. Please join with me during this Lenten season to engage each of these questions.

March 6: Will you continue in the apostle's teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

March 13: Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall onto sin, repent and return to the Lord?

March 20: Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

March 27: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

April 3: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

As we journey together living our lives in the context of our time let us be a people rooted in our baptismal covenant. Let us enter more deeply into this wondrous call.

THOSE THAT DO!

Someone asked me recently what the Senior Warden does. I was momentarily stymied for an explanation; thank goodness George was there. Upon later reflection, however, I see the Senior Warden role as not more important than the rest of the vestry, but just "more." More meetings, more planning, more paperwork...and, the list goes on.

The concept of "more" got me to thinking of some of the things that people in our parish do. I believe that we have an incredibly busy parish with many willing volunteers who work on various committees; teach classes for children, youth, and adults; keep our church operating, functional, and looking nice; who do a lot of things that many of us may not even know there is a need to do. But, sometimes there are people who seem to just do "more." For example, did you know that there is an actual newsletter team responsible for formatting, editing, and preparing the newsletter for mailing? I am told that Karen Holmes established this group over two decades ago and that the group currently includes Karen and Ken Holmes, Bill Fierke, Mike O'Dowd, Elaine Hunt, Ann Lawlor, Gail Duncan, Katie and Kurt Robinson, and Ann Lockhart. Many of these individuals have been volunteering as "counters" for a number of years.

There are so many others in our parish who have devotedly contributed their time and talents to our church, and I know I will get letters from many of you reminding me of those who were not included in this article. And, therein lies my point. So many do so much that goes unrecognized, but not unappreciated. I would love to hear from you about some of these people so that we can include a small acknowledgement of their contributions in upcoming newsletters. On a special note, the inspiration for this article actually came from Dan Loughlin. If I were to list the many activities that Dan was involved in just last year, it would take the entire article. 



When my mother, Joyce Brooks, died at 79 years old, she was buried in a family plot in Florida. She had made these arrangements herself and we honored her wishes. Cary is a long way from the wilds of south Florida.

Over the years, as I remembered my mother, I would have fragmented moments – in the kitchen, where she, my sisters, and I often cooked together – or in a pool, where she taught her children and her grandchildren to swim. I have many memories of my mother – happy, poignant, sad, life-affirming. Sometimes, in church, I would have a quiet time for contemplation (but then I'd miss the homily!). I needed a place closer to my home where I could have time to let my memories flow.

St Paul's lovely Memorial Garden with its Remembrance Wall filled my need. My husband, Ron, suggested we have Mom's name engraved on the Remembrance Wall. This gives her a place close to our family, just as she was close to us in our lives. A garden full of peace and hope and life renewed. I suppose we all love a garden. Being part of nature and its ongoing cycle is appealing.



My mom especially loved to garden, and she gave me this gift of hard work and creativity.

Our church's Memorial Garden with its tall trees, evergreen shrubs, and blooming flowers is the perfect place for me to spend quiet time with my mom. Her spirit is there. Thank you, St. Paul's.




# Church Work Day - March 4th

The 3's, 4's and TK are looking forward to enjoying a wonderful Hot







# Lenten Series: Tuesdays, March 14, 21, & 28 and April 4, 6-7 PM





# Hermano Day- (Farmworker Day) - Sunday, March 26

Thank you for your generous response in helping the Episcopal Farmworker Ministry after it was flooded in the aftermath of Hurricane Matthew. Things are slowly returning to normal at the EFwM and they are now preparing for the arrival of H2A farmworkers from Mexico.

These farmworkers will live in remote and isolated labor camps and come here with only the barest of necessities. St. Paul's and the EFwM have helped for almost twenty years by providing these men with work clothes, bedding, and food. Financial donations to the ministry are also most welcome.

On Sunday, March 26, representatives from the Episcopal Farmworker Ministry will be here to tell us about the work being done to help our farmworker brothers in Christ. Please bring your donations to church that day.

The items most urgently needed are:

- Men's work pants (sizes 24-32)
- Men's socks and athletic shoes (small

sizes)

- Men's long-sleeves shirts (small sizes)
- Men's underwear and t-shirts (small sizes)
- Sheets (twins are best)
- Towels, light blankets, bedding
- Dried or canned beans, rice, fruit.
   (Donated items can be new or used).

An excellent alternative is to make a monetary donation earmarked for either a Welcome Kit or a Shower Kit. Please use the memo part of your check for this and make the check out to the Episcopal Farmworker Ministry. A Shower Kit (\$25.00) will provide a farmworker with shampoo, soap, toothpaste, deodorant, razors, a wash cloth, Bengay, Benadryl and ibuprofen. A Welcome Kit (\$75.00) provides a Shower Kit plus three pairs of used work pants, three used shirts, a towel, a blanket, sheets, and a pillow.






# Music Ministries Preparing for the Seasons Ahead

# Faith Leaders in Cary in Support of Immigrants and Refugees

Hospitality to the stranger is a central tenet of our sacred texts. It is an act of self-giving, welcome, and kindness. In the face of political rhetoric and actions that capitalize on fear to hide the human face of refugees, immigrants, and travelers from Muslimmajority countries, we — as clergy and faith leaders in the Town of Cary, NC — recommit ourselves to the ongoing work of loving our neighbors near and far.

We have, each in our own way, failed to live up to that vision. Despite our shortcomings, the presence of migrants and refugees has enriched our communities. We have been strengthened by their courage and character and thereby challenged to grow closer to one another.

Our refugee and migrant neighbors remind us that we are all sojourners in this land. In our sacred texts, it is worth remembering that the first recipients of unmerited hospitality are not nameless others, but each of us: in gratitude, we merely extend God's hospitality to others.

God's welcome is not liable to partisan claims, and it is our hope and prayer to be faithful witnesses in these divisive times. Today, we make the declaration that we will stand in solidarity with immigrant and refugee communities and commit ourselves to radical hospitality.


