What do you like best about St. Paul's?

I like that St. Paul's is a dynamic and growing parish. When I look around, I see people of all ages and backgrounds. I am excited that we have so many ministry opportunities. Dan and I are blessed to be welcomed back into St. Paul's community after having been away for 11 years. Old friends and new friends have become our extended family who have supported us in times of celebration as well as times of loss.

What are some of your current and past parish ministry involvement and leadership positions at St. Paul's?

When we first came to St Paul's in 1999, we eagerly immersed ourselves into the parish community. I was a Eucharistic Minister, attended Cursillo in 2000, elected to the Vestry in 2001 and served as Junior Warden in 2002. I was a member of the Stewardship Committee in 2000, as well as a member of the Capital Campaign in 2001. I have always been involved in the many Outreach ministries at St. Paul's. I developed and taught 2 courses (Pathways to Grace and Doorways to Grace) to new and current parish members on what the Episcopal Church is all about. I completed 2 years of Education for Ministry (EFM) and I became a member of the Daughters of the King (DOK).

What would you most like to see accomplished during your three years of service on the Vestry?

I would like to help St. Paul's see continued growth by attracting new members, especially families. I think the Visioning Process we are undertaking will allow us to understand the needs of our members going forward. I believe there are opportunities for the numerous ministry
